### **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- All the participants should bring their college Identity Card.
- Registration for the team games Volleyball, Cricket, Football, Basketball and Tug of War is done by sending all the name of members of the team with captain name mentioned with his SAU enrollment number to the e-mail ID **[sausportscommittee2k19@gmail.com](mailto:sausportscommittee2k19@gmail.com)**
- Only one team from a department will be allowed to participate in a particular event valid for only Cricket, Volleyball, Basketball and Football.
- Mixed Doubles is only for the Badminton.
- In the mixed doubles category of badminton inter-department teams are allowed.
- In Doubles of Table Tennis, mixed doubles of Badminton, Doubles of Badminton a team of two players can play as per the team registered at the time of registration.
- No mixed doubles matches in the Table Tennis.
- Participants of all events should report at the assigned venue at least 10 minutes before start of the respective events.
- If any participant is found involved in any indiscipline activity, he/she will be debarred from the tournament immediately.
- Illegal participation of any player/Team in any event will be responsible for disqualification of all teams of the concerned department.

- Decision of the judges/umpires will be final and binding to all.

## **1 RULES OF ATHLETICS.**

### **RACE: 100m, Marathon**

- In all the 100m, each athlete shall have a separate lane.
- An athlete, after assuming a full and final starting position, shall not commence his start until after receiving the report of the whistle.
- In the Marathon which includes the two full rounds of Nehru Park (approx. 5.4 km) for male participants. For the female participants which includes one full round of Nehru Park (approx. 2.7 km).
- Participants of all events should report at the assigned venue at least 10 minutes before start of the respective events.
- If any participant is found involved in any indiscipline activity he/she will be debarred from the event immediately.

### **2. Rules for Basketball**

- 10 min. each quarter with 2min break between the quarters and 5 minutes at half-time.
- Teams should report to the Basket Ball court half an hour before commencement of the match.
- Maximum 8 players are allowed in a team in which 5 players play in the field and rest are substitutes.
- Participants of all events should report at the assigned venue at least 10 minutes before start of the respective events.
- Referee decision is the final decision.
- No players should carry anything in his/her hand or neck (wrist watch, necklace, ring, kada, bracelet etc.).

### **3. Rules of chess**

- The match will be of 20 minutes duration.
- Each player has to complete his/her move in 20 sec.
- If he/she is unable to complete his/her move in 20 sec, then next player will get chance to move.
- After 20 minutes' points of each player will be calculated as:
  1. Pawn is worth 1
  2. Knight is worth 3
  3. Bishop is worth 3
  4. Rook is worth 5
  5. Queen is worth 5
  6. King is infinitely valuable.
- The player having more points against other will win.

### **4. RULES OF FOOTBALL**

- In the football matches, first there are the league matches which includes of each 20 minutes halves and 5 minutes break between the halves.
- Each team can name up to 03 substitute players. Substitutions can be made at any time of the match with each team being able to make a maximum of 3 substitutions per side. In the event of all three substitutes being made and a player having to leave the field for injury the team will be forced to play without a replacement for that players.
- In the semifinals and the final the time allotted for the halves is increased. In the semifinals 25 minutes' halves each and 5 minutes break between the halves and if the game needs to be extra time of two 5 minutes halves added.

Each game must include one referee and two assistant referees (linesmen). If the game needs to head to extra time as a result of both teams being level in a match, then 20 minutes will be added in the form of two 10 minute halves after the allotted 60-minutes (valid for the finals only).

- If teams are still level after extra time, then a penalty shootout must take place but no extra time is given during league matches. In that case of draw points will be share between the teams (valid in league matches only).
- The whole ball must cross the goal line for it to constitute as a goal.
- For fouls committed a player could receive either a yellow or red card depending on the severity of the foul; this comes down to the referee's discretion. The yellow is a warning and a red card is a dismissal of that player. Two yellow cards will equal one red. Once a player is sent off then they cannot be replaced.
- If a ball goes out of play off an opponent in either of the side lines then it is given as a throw in. If it goes out of play off an attacking player on the base line then it is a goal kick. If it comes off a defending player it is a corner kick.
  
- Venue of the game is Civil Service Football Ground.

#### The Offside Rule in Football

Offside can be called when an attacking player is in front of the last defender when the pass is played through to them. If the player is in front of that last defender then he is deemed to be offside and free kick to the defending team will be called. A player cannot be caught offside in their own half. The goalkeeper does not count as a defender. If the ball is played backwards and the player is in front of the last defender then he is deemed to be not offside.

#### **5.RULES OF TABLE TENNIS (Ping Pong)**

It will be a team event. Each team will consist of 4 players.

- Ping pong is played over 3 number of games and the first to 11 points wins each game in league matches.
- But in semifinals and finals there are 5 games of 11 points each.
- Each table tennis player serves twice in turn and serves must be made from an open palm, the ball tossed six inches then struck so it bounces on the service side, clears the net, then bounces on the receiver's side.
- Points are decided as described above and games must be won by two clear points. At 10-10 each player serves once only, in turn, until one player established a two-point lead and wins the game.
- After each game the players rotate both the end of the table from which they are playing as well as who serves and receives the ball first.

- In the deciding game of a match the players swap ends after either player reaches five points.
- Venue of the game is Student Activity Centre.

## **6. RULES OF VOLLEYBALL**

- Each team consists of 6 players and 4 substitutes. Players can be substituted at any time but if they are to return can only be swapped for the player that replaced them.
- Each team can hit the ball up to three times before the ball must be returned. The defensive team can then try and block or return the ball again hitting it a maximum of three times.
- Games are played up to 25 points and must be won by 2 clear points.  
Violations will be called for the following:
  - Stepping over the base line when serving the ball.
  - Ball hits the net and fails to get over the net (If the ball hits the net and still goes over the net then this is perfectly legal).
  - Players are not allowed to carry, palm or run with the ball.
  - Players must not touch the net with any part of the body. If the net is said to have hit them.
  - The ball cannot travel under the net.
  - Players cannot reach over the net and hit the ball.
- Venue of the Volleyball is Lawn Area.

## **7. RULES OF CRICKET**

- In a cricket match there are a 15 players team in which 4 are substitute and 11 players will play on the field during the match.
- Firstly, there are league matches which includes two 10 overs inning each, a 20 overs match.
- After league matches, in semifinal matches which includes two 12 overs inning each, a 24 overs match. In finals match there are two innings of 15 overs each, a 30 overs match.
- In case of tie in league matches points are shared between the teams. But in the semifinals and finals in case of tie winner is decided by the **Super Over**.
- Players are advised to obey the umpire decisions.
- There is no leg bye, LBW.
- In league matches there is 2 overs power play but in semifinals and finals there are 3 overs and 4 overs power play respectively.
- A team is allowed to use 5 bowlers in an inning.
- In semifinal matches 2 bowlers are allowed to bowl 3 overs each and rest 3 bowlers are allowed to bowl 2 overs each. But in finals a bowler can bowl 3 overs.
- Venue of Cricket is Civil Service Cricket Ground, Chankyapuri.

**8. Rules of Badminton** It will be a singles and doubles event. A team consist of one player in singles event and four players in doubles events.

- There are singles, doubles and mixed doubles events.
- All the rules are same as Badminton Association of India (BAI).
- First round of singles, doubles and mixed doubles matches are knockout matches which consist of three sets of 11 points.
- In doubles and mixed doubles team, participants will allow to play with the participant which they registered during the registration (and participants are requested to register only once, in doubles one player can complete the registration).
- Once a team registered, then the players will allow to play in that team only.
- In finals and semifinals there are 3 sets of 21 points each.
- Venue of Badminton is the Foyer Area.

## **9. Rules of Carrom-**

- All rules are same as the **All India Carrom Federation (AICF)**
- For the doubles game, partners sit opposite one another and turns proceed in a clockwise order. Other than that, play is exactly the same as for the singles game. The game has a different character, though, because pieces behind

the baseline can be safely left for the partner to deal with unlike in the singles game where pieces behind the baseline can only be moved by the opponent or by rebounding of the board edges.

- Venue of Badminton is Foyer Area.

**Note: All events will be played following the international game rules.**
